

ORDINANCE NO. 117

An Ordinance concerning the resistance of the officers of the Town of Rico, Colo., and providing a penalty therefor.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Rico, Colo.

Sec. I. If any person shall knowingly or willfully obstruct, resist or oppose any Marshal, Deputy Marshal, or other officer of the town of Rico, or other person duly authorized in serving or attempting to serve any lawful process or order of any Court, Police Magistrate, Judge or Justice of the Peace, or any other legal process whatsoever, or shall assault or beat any Marshal, Deputy Marshal, or other officer or person duly authorized in serving or executing, or attempting to serve or execute any process or order aforesaid, or for having served or executed or attempted to serve or execute the same, or shall assault or beat any Marshal or Deputy Marshal of the town of Rico, in arresting or attempting to arrest any person, for the violation of the ordinances of the Town of Rico, either with or without process or warrant, every person so offending shall be fined in a sum not exceeding One Hundred Dollars, or be imprisoned in the common jail of Dolores County for a term of not exceeding ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.
