

ORDINANCE NO. 131

An Ordinance Concerning Offenders and Offenses in the Nature of Misdemeanors and Fixing a Penalty for violations Thereof.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Rico, Colorado:

Section 1. That the loitering or playing about stores, offices, saloons, abandoned or vacant buildings, and the playing upon or loitering about the streets or alleys, or other public places in the town of Rico, Colorado, of a child under 16 years of age in the night time after 8:30 o'clock P.M. without being in the company of, or having the written permission of the parent or lawful guardian, is hereby declared to be an offense, and any person violating this section shall, upon conviction be fined in a sum not less than one dollar nor more than twenty-five dollars for each offense.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the Marshal or other officer of said town, as may from time to time be designated by resolution, at 8:30 o'clock P.M. each night, to cause the fire bell to ring 8 times or taps, and such ringing shall be conclusive of the time, but the ringing of such bell shall not be necessary in order to enforce the provisions of this article.
