They would also like to receive feedback on the stormwater frequency event that the system will be designed for. Included in the packet is the stormwater system 30% drawing set.

Authorization to proceed with letter of support for Rico Trails Alliance grant application to Athletic Brewing "Two for the Trails" grant program

The Rico Trails Alliance is requesting the Board's authorization of Town staff to provide a letter of support for their grant application to Athletic Brewing.

Consideration of letter of support for the San Juan National Forest's request for fiscal year 2026 funding for the acquisition of the Lizard Head Mesa parcel north of Rico, Colorado (PG. 33-34)

Included in the packet is a letter of support for the San Juan National Forest's request for fiscal year 2026 funding through the Land and Water Conservation Fund to acquire the Lizard Head Mesa parcel (323.48 acres) In additional to the letter, a map of the proposed acquisition has been included in the packet.

Determination of Town of Rico public comment regarding San Miguel Authority for Regional Transportation ("SMART") proposed ballot question for sales, lodging and property tax increases (PG. 35-37)

Included in the packet is a notice of meeting at which the Board of Directors of the San Miguel Authority for Regional Transportation will consider taking acting on proposed tax increases. Attached to the notice is exhibit A, proposed ballot question. The Board should determine if the Town of Rico may want to submit a comment on their proposed ballot question. The SMART Board of Directors meeting will be held on September 5, 2024.

Voluntary lead soils clean up ("VCUP") status

Mayor Pieterse to provide an update on the Voluntary lead soils clean up status.

2024-25 Rico Center grant cycle

The 2024/25 Rico Center grant application is now open. The Board should be prepared to discuss if there are any projects that would align with the Rico Center Grant program that the town may consider applying for.

2025 Budget

Work on the 2025 budget has started. Last year during the Board's review of the 2024 budget there was a discussion about creating a budget committee or assigning Trustees to help or provide input for certain funds.

State Statute requires the first reading of the budget be conducted before October 15, 2024. The regular Board meeting in October is on the 15th. The board will need to consider an additional meeting on either Monday October 7 or Thursday October 10.

Dolores Watershed Wildfire Ready Action Plan Grant – technical assistance team (PG. 38)

The Dolores Watershed Collaborative, DWC, is applying to the Colorado Water Conservation Board to complete a Wildfire Ready Action Plan for the upper Dolores Watershed. A map of the current proposed project area has been included in the packet.

As part of this project the DWC is forming a technical advisory team to work with the consulting firm and the Collaborative to guide this project. The TA team will include DWC staff, partners, and technical professionals supporting the hazard analysis, risk assessment, and development of the mitigation framework. The bulk of TA Team work will occur once the grant is awarded.

DWC anticipates the following timeline for near-term tasks:

- August 16-30: TA Team Proposal Review and Selection
- August 17 Distribute to TA Team
- Review meeting: week of August 25th, decision by Aug 30
- September 3-13: Bidder Notification and contract negotiations as guided by the TA Team
- September TBA: Grant review meeting
- September 20: CWCB Grant submission with input from TA Team

If the grant is awarded, DWC anticipates monthly TA Team meetings beginning this fall or winter to work with the Collaborative and Consultant to guide this project forward. We expect this project to last between 12 and 18 months.

DWC would love to have a representative from the Town of Rico or the Rico community on the TA Team for this project. If there is someone with a background in hydrology, wildfire or watershed science, that would be terrific


The Town of Rico supports the San Juan National Forest's (SJNF) request for fiscal year (FY) 2026 funding through the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) to acquire the Lizard Head Mesa parcel north of Rico, Colorado near Lizard Head Pass. Development of the property and associated year-round access would fragment wildlife habitat in and around the area, diminish scenic viewsheds and potentially threaten public access.

The surrounding SJNF lands attract many resident and non-resident hunters, primarily for big game species (elk, mule deer and black bear). Hunting is a major economic driver for Rico, Dolores County and surrounding communities in southwest Colorado. The area is also a very popular destination for public viewing of fall colors and for mushroom gathering.

The property is within 1/3 mile of the Congressionally Designated Lizard Head Wilderness Area. Additionally, the land immediately adjacent to the northern boundaries of the parcel are classified as Roadless Areas under the Colorado Roadless Rule of 2012. Acquisition of the Lizard Head Mesa property will help to promote the wilderness values of the surrounding area by preventing any future development of the land which will also protect scenic viewsheds.

AUTHORIZATION OF FUNDING FOR THE TELLURIDE-MOUNTAIN VILLAGE GONDOLA AND OTHER PROJECTS AND PURPOSES OF THE SAN MIGUEL AUTHORITY FOR REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION.

SHALL SAN MIGUEL AUTHORITY FOR REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION ("SMART") TAXES BE INCREASED \$8,200,000 IN 2025 AND BY WHATEVER ADDITIONAL AMOUNTS AS ARE RAISED ANNUALLY THEREAFTER, FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAINTAINING AND IMPROVING GONDOLA AND SMART TRANSPORTATION SERVICES, INCLUDING:
