Rico School Committee to provide update on the Rico School Annexation/Detachment community engagement session.

A member of the Rico School Committee will provide an update on their community engagement session. This meeting is scheduled for June 21 from 6-7 PM at the Rico Town Hall. The committee is hosting additional community engagement meetings in Telluride and Dove Creek.

### Bohannan Huston to provide update on the wastewater preliminary engineering report.

Donzil Worthington of Bohannan Huston will be meeting with town staff on June 21 to discuss the wastewater preliminary engineering report and potential sites for a treatment plant. He will be attending the meeting that evening to present to the Board of Trustees.

Review and execution, as concurring party, of a Memorandum of Agreement between the United States Forest Service (San Juan National Forest), and the Colorado State Historic Preservation Officer, regarding adverse effects to site 5dl.478.19 resulting from the Atlantic Richfield Company small tracts act case no. 2020 project, Dolores County, Colorado amendment 2

Include in the packet is an MOA between the USFS and the Colorado State Historic Preservation regarding small tracts act case no 2020 Atlantic Richfield Company. In addition to the agreement a plat of the proposed tract has been included. The Forest Service has requested that the town sign the agreement as a concurring party. In accordance with 36 CFR § 800.6(c)(3), a concurring party is a consulting party invited to concur in the agreement document but who does not have the authority to amend or terminate the agreement.

Like an invited signatory's signature, a concurring party signature is not required to execute the agreement; a concurring signature is essentially an endorsement of the agreement. Thus, the refusal to sign by any party asked to concur in the agreement does not prevent the agreement from being executed. Whether any or all other consulting parties are invited to concur in an agreement is at the federal agency's sole discretion. Extending the offer to sign an agreement as a concurring party may be an effective way of recognizing the assistance and support that a party has provided for the actions being evidenced in the agreement and encouraging their ongoing support.

Signing the amendment doesn't obligate the Town of Rico to any work, it only endorses the agreement and the change.

Review and execution of Resolution 2023-04 a Resolution of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Rico, Colorado approving the Final Plat of the Dolores River Trail Subdivision, Rico Colorado

Included in this packet is a resolution approving the Dolores River Trail Subdivision. This subdivision was approved by the Board of Trustees at the April 19, 2023 meeting. Execution of this resolution is a required step in the subdivision process.

Consideration of second reading Ordinance No. 2023-03 an ordinance of the Town of Rico, Colorado extending the temporary moratorium on the acceptance of new land use applications for major or minor subdivisions, and residential or commercial planned unit developments.

Included in this packet is ordinance No. 2023-03 which would extend the temporary moratorium on accepting new land use applications for major or minor subdivisions, and residential or commercial planned unit developments until December 31, 2023. As discussed at last month's meeting, Town staff and contract employees need more time to work through water issues and availability, and funding opportunities. The first reading of this ordinance was approved May 17, 2023.

### Consideration of liquor license for 2 Rico LLC, dba Silver Creek Rico

Included in this packet is a liquor license for 2 Rico LLC, dba Silver Creek Rico. This application is complete, compliant, and properly noticed.

# Consideration of special event liquor license for Rico Frequency, Street Dance on Mantz July 4<sup>th</sup> event.

Included in this packet is a liquor license for the Rico Frequency Non-profit, Street Dance on Mantz, July 4th event. This application is complete, compliant, and properly noticed.

### Voluntary lead soils clean up ("VCUP") status

Mayor Pieterse to provide an update on the Voluntary lead soils clean up status.

### Water system updates

There are currently many water system projects being contemplated. Reactivating Silver Creek, including the intake, waterline, and treatment plan, replacing or restoring the third water storage tank, upgrading the water meter reading system (AMI), rate and impact fee study, and subsurface utility engineering and GIS mapping. Some of these projects could happen in 2023 and would require a budget amendment.

Silver Creek Water System and Storage Tank

A request for funding this project is currently being reviewed by a congressional subcommittee and could be included in the 2024 Fiscal Year Federal Budget. In addition to the Town's CDS request, this project has been submitted to the State Revolving Loan Fund.

### AMI Meter reading

The new water meters the town is using allow for remote reading through a gateway and antenna system. Currently town staff reads meters through a handheld device. If the board elects to move forward with the AMI systems, meters can be read every 15 minutes without staff needing to be in the field. Being able to read meters daily can help the town alert property owners of leaks in real time and would save unnecessary water consumption. Town has provided an asset list and service address list to Neptune to start the propagation study needed to determine gateway location is cost. Initial cost estimates are around \$20,000 – \$50,000.

### Rate and Impact Fee Study

Karl Hanlon of KNH provided recommendations for a firm, Gov Rates, that could conduct a rate and impact fee study. (Gov Rates conducted a study for Glenwood Springs, another municipality who is

represented by KNH) This study is necessary if the Board elects to adopt an ordinance to impose impact fees to developers.

Subsurface Utility Engineering and GIS Mapping

Subsurface utility engineering is the service of mapping subsurface utilities. Although there is a map of the town's water system, it is dated, missing items, and has some discrepancies. A meeting is scheduled, at the beginning of July, with Goff Engineering to discuss the scope of this project and potential pricing. Once the town engages in this service, we will need to obtain GIS software to utilize the data. The result of this project would allow for town staff to utilize handheld devices, in the field, to locate watermains, valves, curb stops, meter pits, and service lines.

### Historic Commercial/Commercial properties in violation of the Rico Land Use Code

The board and town staff should discuss properties that are in violation of the RLUC within the historic commercial and commercial zone district.

# RESULTING FROM THE ATLANTIC RICHFIELD COMPANY SMALL TRACTS ACT CASE NO. 2020 PROJECT,

# DOLORES COUNTY, COLORADO AMENDMENT 2

WHEREAS, the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) was executed on February 3, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the MOA Amendment 1 was executed on July 8, 2022; and

WHEREAS, it was determined that the undertaking would not result in the transfer of 19.1 of the originally consulted upon 39.99 acres out of federal ownership and updating this information is needed to more accurately account for the undertaking discussed and defined in the MOA; and

WHEREAS, the USFS has defined the undertaking's area of potential effect as the 39.99 acres situated in the west half (W1/2) of Section 25, Township 40, Range 11 West, N.M.P.M depicted on the plat deposited with the Dolores County Clerk and Recorder's Office on September 26, 2019 as Survey 1-210, a copy of which is shown in Attachment 1 of this Memorandum of Agreement (MOA); and

with the following:

WHEREAS, the United States Forest Service, San Juan National Forest (USFS) is proposing to transfer 20.89 acres of land out of federal ownership to the Atlantic Richfield Company (ARC) in Dolores County, Colorado as part of the Atlantic Richfield Company Small Tracts Act Case No. 2020 Project; and

WHEREAS, the USFS has defined the undertaking's area of potential effect as the 20.89 acres situated in the west half (W1/2) of Section 25, Township 40, Range 11 West, N.M.P.M depicted on the plat deposited with the Dolores County Clerk and Recorder's Office on October 27, 2022 under reception number 172250, a copy of which is shown in Attachment 1 of this Memorandum of Agreement (MOA); and



### TOWN OF RICO ORDINANCE NO. 2023-03

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF RICO, COLORADO EXTENDING THE TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON THE ACCEPTANCE OF NEW LAND USE APPLICATIONS FOR MAJOR OR MINOR SUBDIVISIONS, AND RESIDENTIAL OR COMMERCIAL PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENTS.

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Rico, Colorado (the "Town") is a Colorado home rule municipality organized pursuant to Article XX of the Colorado Constitution and with the authority of the Rico Home Rule Charter (the "Charter"); and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to C.R.S. §§ 29-20-101 *et seq.*, 31-15-101 *et seq.*, and 31-23-101 *et seq.*, the Town has broad authority to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the community and its residents; and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 2022-13, the Town imposed a temporary moratorium on the acceptance of new applications for Major or Minor Subdivisions and for Residential or Commercial Planned Unit Developments through June 30, 2023 while it reviewed alternatives for water system improvements to increase water availability as well as options for funding said improvements;

WHEREAS, the Town continues to evaluate improvement and funding alternatives to increase water availability to meet the demands of future growth and development within the Town; and

**WHEREAS**, in order to promote the public health, safety, and welfare of the Town's residents, the Board of Trustees finds it is necessary to extend the temporary moratorium on new applications for Major or Minor Subdivisions and for Residential or Commercial Planned Unit Developments.

# NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF RICO THAT:

**Section 1.** The recitals above are hereby adopted as findings and incorporated herein.

Section 2. Upon the effective date of this Ordinance, the Town of Rico hereby extends the temporary moratorium on the acceptance of all applications for approval of minor or major subdivisions submitted under Article V of the Rico Land Use Code ("RLUC"), and all applications for approval of Residential or Commercial Planned Unit Developments submitted under Article III of the RLUC, as enacted by Ordinance No. 2022-13, which is incorporated by this reference, until December 30, 2023. This temporary moratorium shall automatically terminate on December 30, 2023, unless terminated earlier by the Board of Trustees or extended in its duration by enactment of another Ordinance.
